- Survey feedback supplements meeting discussions regarding the future priorities of the section


Key Takeaways



- Education/best practices.


Engagement: What can the Section do to increase local membership and provide more interest in planning?

- Bring a friend campaign encourage members to bring a friend to events or meetings.
- Share basic information about the chapter what it does, who is in it.
- As the section becomes more active, the benefit of membership will become more evident.
 - Possibly more event / CM planning to bring the regional planners out. Giving them reasons to engage more and then in turn become more involved/active, which could drum up more interest.
- CM Credits Reduced fees for members may encourage membership.
- Easy engagement methods hybrid meetings, social events that occur in different locations throughout the section area, perhaps bi-monthly.
 - A variety of activities (not just online and not just happy hour-type socials).
 - Email outreach and virtual participation options.
- Get involved with colleges and high schools. just graduated and even if people aren't planning majors they're into it. Planning is trendy right now!
 - Maybe programming at local colleges- Kutztown University has a Planner Track in their Geography program. I'm sure they would be open to the Chapter visiting.
- There are some new planners. They need to be invited to the table and understand the resources available to them. LVPC AND Berks County can help with this.
- Encourage county planning commissions to promote municipal participation.



How are you involved in the planning industry?




Are you currently an APA National member?





Are you currently an APA PA member?




